I write today during my first week as rabbi of Temple Beth Israel. This morning we gathered on Zoom for a spirited morning minyan, which was my first service as rabbi here. ### **Security and High Holy Day Registration**



We warmly welcome you to attend holiday services in the sanctuary, whether you join us in person or by Zoom. For our <u>in-person</u> option, we will have these security practices for everyone:

- \* You must register in advance to attend services during the High Holy Days. We don't need to know which services you'll attend—only that you may be at TBI's building for at least one.
- \* Once you register, we will mail you a security pass that provides building access during the High Holy Day services. You should bring it with you whenever you attend.
- \* We will have a security detail posted outside the building. They will check your pass.
- \* If you forget your pass, they will ask us to check your name on our master list of those who are registered, before you can enter. To avoid confusion or delay, the best option is to bring your pass.

### How to register for your TBI High Holy Days security pass:

- \* The preferred way to register is through our <u>online registration form; Click Here</u> or you can find a link to it on the TBI website.
- \* If you cannot use the link, please call Andrea Baron at the TBI office at 781-894-5146. Please give her the names of all people in your group needing passes, and the mailing address to which she should send them.
- \* We will mail a pass for each person whose name you provide, and place each name on the master list, as we realize you may not all arrive at the same time. Please be sure to include only people who actually may attend.

#### Deadlines:

- Please submit the form or call no later than September 8th to ensure we have enough time to mail your pass(es).
- \* If you submit the form or call between September 9th and 14th, we will attempt to mail the passes but there is an increased chance that they will arrive late.
- \* If you submit the form or call after September 14th, we will add your name to our master list to allow entry, but we will not be able to mail you a pass.
- We cannot accept registrations to attend after September 22nd.

Thank you for your participation in our efforts to provide a safe environment for us to gather as a community. All the best.

# Temple Beth Israel **Memorial Park**

Temple Beth Israel has maintained a cemetery for its members since 1951. Beth Israel Memorial Park is located on South Street, between the Stanley Elementary School and Children's Hospital. Graves are available in Section A (the right side as you enter the cemetery), Section B (the left side



as you enter the cemetery) and in Kulanu (the left side, after Section B). The cost to purchase an individual grave in Sections A or B for Temple members is \$2,200 (\$4,400 for two). The cost for nonmembers is \$3,600 per grave, which includes one year of membership.

You must be a Temple member for two or more consecutive years to take advantage of Member pricing; Non-member pricing applies to all others.

Kulanu is dedicated to serving the needs of Jewish Temple members who are married to a non-Jewish spouse. Graves in the Kulanu interfaith section are sold in lots of two, at a total cost of \$4,400 for members. The cost for non-members is \$7,200 for a lot of two, which includes one year of family membership.
