## Brought To You By Rabbi Ben: The Light from our Torah

The Israeli singer Hanan ben Ari sings the following words about how we find ourselves in the stories in our Torah from his song Cholem Kemo Yosef:

*Every person is expelled from the Garden of Eden*

*Everyone undergoes a flood*

*Every person has some Abel*

*About whom he is deathly jealous*

*In everyone there is a tower of rebellion and confusion*

I shared these words on Simchat Torah, October 7. That day we were just beginning to find out about the attack from Gaza. That day was a flood, full of confusion and anger. On that day we were expelled from our previously considered place of safety.

We find ourselves today in fearful times, with war in Israel and rising anti-Semitism close to home.

But like we did on that fateful Simchat Torah, we can find

comfort and grounding knowing that our ancestors faced similar challenges and persevered through them, never losing sight of their dreams and aspirations.

Hanan ben Ari continues:

*Yet I also dream like Joseph*

*Yes they also threw me into the pit...*

*And like David I make it into a psalm*

*Make it into a psalm*

Our ancestors never gave up their dreams in the face of danger. Like Joseph, they continued to dream and strive for greatness even when thrown into a pit. They formed large families when barren, they settled our homeland against all odds, and they built a society of justice and righteousness in an oppressive world.

In doing so, like King David, they lived lives that were bigger

# Temple Beth Israel Memorial Park



Temple Beth Israel has maintained a cemetery for its members since 1951. Beth Israel Memorial Park is located on South Street, between the Stanley Elementary School and Children's Hospital. Graves are available in Section A (the right side as you enter the cemetery), Section B (the left side as you enter the cemetery) and in Kulanu (the left side, after Section B). The cost to purchase an individual grave in Sections A or B for Temple members is \$2,200 (\$4,400 for two). The cost for non-members is \$3,600 per grave, which includes one year of membership.

You must be a Temple member for two or more consecutive years to take advantage of Member pricing; Non-member pricing applies to all others.

Kulanu is dedicated to serving the needs of Jewish Temple members who are married to a non-Jewish spouse. Graves in the Kulanu interfaith section are sold in lots of two, at a total cost of \$4,400 for members. The cost for non-members is \$7,200 for a lot of two, which includes one year of family membership.
