Brought To You By Rabbi Ben: Adding Our Light

Shalom!

I write to you the day after our Annual Meeting filled with pride, joy, and hope for our community. Pride in all of our accomplishments this year, joy at the celebration of our community, and hope in what is to come next year and beyond.

Yesterday I shared how in the Torah portion of Beha'alotcha, Aaron kindles the flames of the menorah in the Tabernacle. This light has represented our people's devotion to God and to one another from the times of the Bible until today. In 1914, 110 years ago, we lit the light of the menorah here in Waltham when Temple Beth Israel established its location here on Harvard Street. It is a remarkable accomplishment

that this light remains strong today. It is now on us to carry that flame forward by each adding our own light to the flame of our community.

There are so many ways we have added our light this year. So many stepped up to organize and execute a joyous Passover seder for the first time in 5 years. So many step up each week to lead services, read Torah, and share meaningful teachings. So many came out just one day after the fast of Yom Kippur to build our sukkah. So many volunteered at our warming center and contributed to area organizations to share our community's light with others. 


Yiddush Literature with Martha Tolpin

Temple Beth Israel Memorial Park

Temple Beth Israel has maintained a cemetery for its members since 1951. Beth Israel Memorial Park is located on South Street, between the Stanley Elementary School and Children's Hospital. Graves are available in Section A (the right side as you enter the cemetery), Section B (the left side as you enter the cemetery) and in Kulanu (the left side, after Section B). The cost to purchase an individual

grave in Sections A or B for Temple members is \$2,200 (\$4,400 for two). The cost for non-members is \$3,600 per grave, which includes one year of membership.

You must be a Temple member for two or more consecutive years to take advantage of Member pricing; Non-member pricing applies to all others.

Kulanu is dedicated to serving the needs of Jewish Temple members who are married to a non-Jewish Graves in the Kulanu interfaith section are sold in lots of two, at a total cost of \$4,400 for members. The cost for non-members is \$7,200 for a lot of two, which includes one year of family membership.
