Preserving the Legacy



Morris Hollender's story and music are a testament to perseverance, resilience, and a positive spirit. Born in Czechoslovakia in 1925, after surviving Auschwitz he came to Waltham where he served as Temple Beth Israel's Torah reader and lay cantor for many decades while also sharing stories, jokes, folkwisdom, and songs. Prior to his death in 2014, Hankus Netsky worked with Morris Hollender to collect the melodies he brought with him from his childhood. These will be among the beautiful music featured at the concert.



Hankus Netsky, a noted multi-instrumentalist, composer, and scholar of Jewish music, founded the Klezmer Conservatory Band, and is a major figure in the contemporary resurgence of traditional Jewish music, collaborating with notable figures like Itzhak Perlman, Theodore Bikel, Joel Grey, and Robin Williams. Hankus developed a close relationship with Morris Hollender, extensively cataloging and recording his vast musical repertoire, ensuring its preservation for future generations.

Eden MacAdam-Somer has showcased her talents internationally, including performances in Afghanistan and China, and collaborates with various ensembles while maintaining a vibrant solo career. A Houston native, she refined her craft at prestigious music schools before joining Netsky in both performance and educational endeavors.

Rabbi Jessica Kate Meyer received her ordination at Hebrew College in 2014 and has 10 years of pulpit experience, first at Romemu in New York and then at The Kitchen in San Francisco. She currently serves as director of the Musicant Cohen Center for Performing Arts at Hebrew College.

Clarinetist **Itay Dayan** is considered one of today's most promising voices in klezmer music.
